From the (Reedham) Rectory

This morning, walking very early along the Halvergate Road we came to a wild cherry tree and looking up, saw bunches of bright red cherries all over the tree. There were too many for the birds to scoff them all and, stretching up, I was able to reach some and enjoy them. It made me think of God's amazing bounty and, as we gathered the cherries, we saw a rainbow over to the west.

This Saturday I shall be speaking about God's bounty, his promises and the rainbow when I baptise a baby whose name is Noah. In the Book of Genesis it was to Noah that God made the original rainbow promise when he said: "I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth. Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds, I will remember my covenant between me and you and all living creatures of every kind. Never again will the waters become a flood to destroy all life."

It is a comforting thought especially as there is so much concern now around global warming, climate change and rising sea levels. Just two days ago an iceberg - one of the largest on record - broke away from an ice shelf in Antarctica. Researchers have been monitoring a huge crack in the Larsen C Ice Shelf, which had left a vast iceberg more than four times the size of London or a quarter the size of Wales "hanging by a thread". On Wednesday the 2,200 square mile iceberg broke off. It is now free and able to move off into the Southern Ocean. Actually this particular iceberg, frightening though it is, has little to do with global warming as such. It was something that has happened before in past history when an ice shelf becomes unstable.

What it does make me realise is that we can look at fruitful cherry trees and sincerely thank God but we are not able to take on board the scope of our creation, the vastness of the universe and our tiny place in it; the diversity of our earth and the amazing pattern of our seasons and our lives. God, our creator, has made promises to us, but what are we doing in return? Whether you believe in climate change or not, one fact is sure, we are not taking care of our beautiful world as we should. Many of the earth's wild creatures are threatened with extinction. Their populations have fallen by 67% in the last 50 years yet we continue to take out rainforests and other vital habitats. At

the same time the human race is still increasing at a rate that will simply fill the earth and leave room for nothing else.

Somehow, I have managed to move from a beautiful cherry tree to a dire warning and I didn't mean to be so negative. I trust God and know that, in the end, we can trust him and rely on his love for us, his children. I am certain that we will learn to care for our planet as we should, although it may not be in my lifetime. And, as long as I live, I will pray that one day all humanity will recognise and turn to our creator God and accept his promise to care for us.

Reedham Parish Council

Meeting held on Monday 3rd July 2017 at Reedham Village Hall

There were 11 Councillors present and the Clerk. 3 members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were received from the County Councillor, the Borough Councillor and the Chairman of the Village Hall. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

The Council commended Norfolk County Council verge trimmers for the precise and considerate work they have done around the village.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury provided the following report:

Disappointingly there was vandalism of the new notice boards and the pavilion door sometime over the weekend from Friday 16^{th} and Monday 19^{th} June. Fund raising: the cash bingo jackpot stands at £190 in 49 numbers or less. The Quiz in June raised £105 toward the light and sound fund. The Village Fete is on the 16^{th} July. The main area attractions will be vintage and classic cars and dog agility. Street Dancers, by Drury Academy, and Reedham Primary School dance and orchestra will also be performing.

The agreement for the reopening of the Permissive Path between the Parish Council and Mr Mutten has now been signed. The Council is now waiting for Mr Mutten to dredge the dyke, and to receive the specifications for the bridge.

The walk on the 17th June organised by the village was attended by 60 people and raised £179 for the Permissive Path.

Work on repairing the Woodland Walk steps should have commenced on the 10^{th} July.

Two planning applications were discussed: 10 scrapes on the Marshes as part of the river defence work, and a single storey rear extension at The Dolls House, 39a Witton Green. The Council had no objections to either application.

A speed sensor similar to the one in Freethorpe will be purchased by the Parish Council. It will be moved around at least 3 sites within the village.

Conservation management of the churchyard is going well at present with 50% more old grassland plants, butterflies and birds reported in the area.


