# From the (Reedham) Rectory

The year is moving on again and it is at this time of year that we stop to reflect on the past. There were several Remembrance Day Services in the Benefice and each year it is a moment in time when we gather together to remember the fallen. I was at Halvergate Memorial this year and, despite the rain, which appeared at I I.00am, it felt absolutely right to be standing silently for two minutes as a tribute to those who fought and died for our freedom. Remembrance Sunday marks the turn of the year and we are truly in autumn now. 2017 has been the warmest year on record and this year our autumn is very gold and yellow and beautiful. We are moving into the busiest time of the Church year now and we will soon be singing Carols. Already Christmas has been with us in the shops and on the TV for some weeks. There are lots of services and plenty of opportunity to join us at some time in December to sing or to enjoy the choir.

In Reedham there will be Carols at the Station on 15<sup>th</sup> and Carols at the Vikings Club on the 22<sup>nd</sup>. On Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> at 11.00am at Freethorpe Church Bishop Alan is coming along to dedicate the amazing new altar kneelers in the Church and there is a buffet lunch to follow. On Monday the 18<sup>th</sup> there is a Dickensian Carol Service at Acle Church. On the 20<sup>th</sup> there is a special Carol service with the Benefice Choir at Reedham Church in the evening. We will also be singing carols at The Rampant Horse in Freethorpe on the 21<sup>st</sup> December. There are also Christingle Services and the special Crib Service at Reedham on Christmas Eve when the Posada will return and every child will be able to search and find something very special to take home.

There are other Christmas services too which are listed in the magazine but, as we rush around in the Church preparing all these services, in between doing our Christmas shopping and preparing for the festivities, we feel that it is the one of the best seasons for us even though, at the end, we might be tired.

What we are doing, what I am doing, is holding on to the true spirit of Christmas. It is lovely to see the adverts – the John Lewis monster is especially sweet – and it is excellent to see the shops full of amazing gifts and colour and brightness, but most of all this season, this festival, is about Jesus Christ and his birth. He came into the world as a helpless child but 2000 and more years later more people each year come to believe in him and in what he came to do. He came as the Prince of Peace to teach us to love one another and live in peace and freedom with one another.

I hope you make one or more of the Carol Services and enjoy them. I hope you have a happy Christmas holiday and I hope that, during the festivities you find a moment to remember the Christ child because he also died for us and he died to give us freedom.

# Reedham Parish Council - meeting Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> October

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Grant Nurden and Chris Bradbury Chairman of the Village Hall. 4 members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were received from Councillor Thompson and County Councillor Iles. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

Broadland District Council has awarded the garden waste disposal contract to the joint venture company NEWS.

2 planning applications were considered: concerns were raised about the new documents submitted for the oil tank and mooring at Seven Mile House; an area affected by the ground raising contains plants that are not found elsewhere in East Norfolk. The office extension, new boat house and replacement of existing boathouse raised no objections.

There are several vacant plots on the allotments. Anyone interested please contact the Clerk or Paul Bilverstone - 01493 701344. Allotment rents are due for the year. Please send to the Clerk - 31 Mill Lane, Acle, NR13 3BJ.

Confirmation has been received that the grant applications for the Permissive Path steps and bridge have been successful. Work on dredging the dyke and levelling the footpath should start in early November. Installation of the steps and bridge will begin once the dredged soil has dried out.

# Meeting held on Monday $6^{th}$ November 2017 at Reedham Village Hall

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, County Councillor Brian Iles and Chris Bradbury Chairman of the Village Hall. 5 members of the public were in attendance plus Mr M Thompson from Small Fish and Mr J Parker from Parker Planning Services. Apologies were received from Councillor Hale. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

Councillor Paul Bilverstone resigned from the Council during the month. Appreciation for his commitment to the Council was expressed and thanks were given for his work in setting up and managing the allotments.

Norfolk County Council will be consulting on the next budget allocation. County Councillor lles urged residents to respond to the consultation in order that local priorities can be taken into account.

County Councllor Iles also confirmed he has authorised the release of £2,000 from his budget to go towards the reopening of the Permissive Path.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury provided the following report: Children have been climbing on the roof of the pavilion and have broken some roof tiles, and have broken a paving slab at the entrance. Fund raising: the cash bingo jackpot stands at £230 in 53 numbers or less. Bonfire night was once again very well supported, no figure yet

on the amount raised. The next film showing will be in the New Year. There will be a 50/50 auction on the 18<sup>th</sup> November. A Christmas Fayre is to be held on the 3<sup>rd</sup> December, I till 3:30 pm, and the next quiz is a Christmas Quiz on the 13<sup>th</sup> December at 7:30 pm.

There will be a third Village Walk to raise funds for the Permissive Path on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> December from the Ship at 11 am.

A Heritage Lottery Fund application for the Broads Authority has been successful and £80,000 of this will be spent on an archaeological and geo-diversity project in Reedham & surrounds through to 2021.

No planning applications were received.

There are the Christingles - celebrating the Light and Saviour of the World with the symbol of the orange, fruits, red band and candle. There are Carol Services - some outside, some in churches. The service at Freethorpe on Sunday 17th is a congregational service with our area Bishop, Alan – we hope the congregations of Acle and Reedham will join the Freethorpe Church for this celebration. Acle has its intriguingly named 'Dickensian Carol Service' the following Monday with St Edmund's Primary School, and Reedham hosts a Processional Carol Service on Wednesday 20th, directed by Dr Michael Nicholas, formerly Master of the Music at Norwich Cathedral, with the Acle and Bure to Yare Benefice Choir. Acle has the First Communion of Christmas at 8pm, following the old custom of starting the Feast Day celebration at the evening, rather than making the break between days midnight as is customary now. (Evening time and Morning, the First Day -Genesis I.) Halvergate starts their first Communion at 11.30pm on Christmas Eve, so the Consecration will fall just after midnight on 25th. There is then a Book of Common Prayer Celebration at 8am at Acle, with Mass at 9.15am for the Roman Catholic congregation, a Family friendly service at 10am at Freethorpe, and Holy Communion at 11.00am at Reedham. Do try to make it to at least one of these services, and share in the wonderful joy at the heart of Christmas.
