New Data Protection regulations came into force last month. Please don't stop reading: this isn't about privacy notices (try the benefice website) or consent forms! Over recent years, legislation and policy have tended to expand the region of what is considered "private" and therefore to be protected, in contrast to what is assumed to be "public". A hospital won't tell you or me that someone is an in-patient unless we already know: our health is considered a private matter: not to be shared unless we want it to be - something we have to be sensitive about in public prayer. Christian Aid week collectors mustn't try to collect from houses displaying a "No cold callers" sticker; the same collectors will know of houses which are, perhaps intentionally, difficult to access; have no doorbell or knocker; or where nobody comes to the door even when it looks very much as though someone is in. We cannot assume that people will want to engage with the community where they live – although the time may come when they might welcome its support. Whatever the details of the case, the decisions not to grant Acle Parish Council a compulsory purchase order for extension of the cemetery have upheld the interests of a private landowner against those of a public body.

Technology is turning what were public activities into private ones: a visit to the local shop or bank is becoming an on-line transaction. At the same time, it is having a reverse effect. Through social media, people are sharing personal thoughts and images with a much wider audience than they would have in the past; and leaving an indelible trail which may be accessed in the future — something young people need to be particularly aware of. This isn't necessarily a paradox: the ability to publicise things widely, freely and rapidly has to some extent given rise to the desire to protect privacy.

Our personalities feed into this: extraverts get their energy from being with others; introverts need their own space to recharge. Jesus exercised a very public and demanding ministry. But he also valued time alone with God: withdrawing to lonely places to pray. We know that God knows us intimately, whether we decide to share with others or not. Yet Christianity cannot be a private religion: Jesus didn't just call individuals, but formed a community, and commanded us to love one another. He also promoted giving one's life over, rather than seeking to preserve it. For the baptised, our lives are no longer our own – if they ever were.

It's impressive to hear individual stories like Colin's; the figures are impressive, too: through its various projects and facilities the Trust is providing care and support to around 200 people at any one time.

The Benefice Mothers' Union has been supporting the Vidyal Trust for more than 10 years. Pat Atkinson has just returned from Madurai, South India, having paid 53 visits since the first 28 years ago. It's a much changed India since then, with massive improvements in roads and communications, though Madurai has not changed much except they no longer have street children. Most still live in shacks and an alarming number of children have cancer. The Vidyal Trust helps by getting them pain relief and family support. The Government supplies free treatment but medication has to be paid for. They have one ambulance to cover over a 200 mile radius of the hospital, so the Trust pay for help to reach the hospital - £8 for each needy family. The Leprosy home and the Farm continue to flourish despite many years of serious drought.

Two former Trust children, now staff members, are coming to Brundall this June. They are Muthu Kumar, Kartil and Ranjith. There are events where we can meet them: I Ith June at the Virgin Lounge, White Lion Street, Norwich 3pm-5pm; an on Sunday 10th June they will be visiting churches in the Yare Valley Benefice. There will also be a Cream Tea at 2.30pm and a Curry Evening at 6pm at Postwick Village Hall on 22nd June. Reedham Gardening Club

As bedding plants are planted out, and baskets and tubs filled, we must remember to watch for pests. Lily beetles – bright red but evasive – are best picked off. They drop down to the soil with any movement. Aphids will be attacking roses, and slugs and snails do their feeding at night. Wood ash or broken egg shells are a deterrent. Baskets and tubs need watering daily and fed with tomato fertiliser fortnightly.

Vegetables can be planted out if grown in a greenhouse or direct in the soil for a later crop. Quick growing salad leaves, lettuces or radishes, mature in about 3 weeks.
