### Love, Pancakes and Passion

As I was thinking about my article today, I realised that there were three things I wanted to mention and they seem to fit well together. The first is love and today, as I write, it is Valentine's Day. It is a day that is exciting when you are young, comforting as you grow older, and lonely if you find yourself alone. This year, as ever, young men and women will have been deciding what to send or thinking about what to cook for their other halves and, in my age group, we might spend time thinking and sometimes laughing about those early Valentine days we shared.

The original Valentine was a Roman Priest during the time when Emperor Claudius II had forbidden the marriage of young people as he believed that unmarried soldiers fought better than married ones, because married soldiers might be afraid of what would happen to their wives or families if they died. Valentine used to conduct the marriages of young Christians secretly. When he was found out he was executed in the year 269 and legend has it that he wrote a note to Asterius' daughter before he died and inspired today's romantic notes by signing it, "from your Valentine."

The next significant day after Valentine's Day is Shrove Tuesday and our Pancake Party is planned. It will be at the end of February at the Village Hall and, like last year, I expect it will be a lot of fun and with delicious pancakes. But those pancakes signify something important and historical. 'Shrove' comes from the Anglo Saxon word 'shrive' which means being absolved from guilt and in the middle ages everyone went to Confession on Shrive Tuesday as well as eating lots of tasty food like pancakes. So the Pancake Party is our feast day before the start of Lent on Ash Wednesday when we move into a time of fasting in preparation for Easter.

And so we move on into March and April and to my third word Passion. For over a hundred of us in Reedham and from surrounding villages, preparing for Easter is different this year to any year before. We are working on, planning, making costumes for, building sets for, writing publicity and rehearsing for our Passion Play. It will take place on Good Friday afternoon and each scene will be in a different location in Reedham. It will begin at Reedham School at 1.30pm. It then moves along The Hills and will end at Ferry Farm on Station Road.

It is a free event, with free refreshments beforehand at the village hall from 12 noon and we invite everyone to come along and watch the story of Jesus' trial and crucifixion. It is an amazing story to tell. We have a hundred people directly involved but, within the community, many more have given their time, money and abilities to make the Reedham Passion Play possible and, as part of what we are doing, all donations made on the day will go to the East Anglian Air Ambulance.

I hope you will come and share the Good Friday story with us. Lorna

In the vegetable garden, potatoes can be started into growth ready for planting at the end of the month. Seeds of onions, leeks and cabbages can be sown under cover. It is a good time to spread compost so the worms take it down into the soil.
