From the (Reedham) Rectory

3.

Lately Monday afternoons at Reedham Rectory have not been as quiet as usual. A new team of bell ringers has begun to practice and I am reminded each week of the very special date that is coming up next month. This year Remembrance Day, the 11th November, actually falls on a Sunday and it will be one hundred years since the end of the Great War. The national plan was to recruit some 1,400 bell ringers during this year, throughout the country. They will represent the 1,400 bell ringers who died in the conflict. In fact many more bell ringers have been recruited and in future I think we will hear church bells ring out again on Sundays in villages everywhere. On 11 November bells in churches and cathedrals will be rung and Big Ben will also strike for the centenary of Armistice Day. Church bells were rung in celebration when armistice was declared in 1918, after having been restricted during the four-year war. You should listen out for the bells on the day.

Our armed forces are also hoping to send uniformed personnel to as many Church Remembrance Services as they can. It will be a day when we can look back and recall those who fought for our freedom. There are still many among us who can remember parents or relatives who served in the war or lost brothers, husbands and boyfriends in the war. Many who are my age can remember older relatives, like my own Great Uncle Sid, who fought in the war and came back. They didn't tell the tale though, they didn't have stories. It had been so terrible that few of the returning men ever talked about it. It is sobering to think that, twenty years from now, only a very few people will be left who personally knew those who endured that great and terrible war. So we should remember and continue to remember and always pray for and seek peace wherever it can be found. At Reedham Church there will be an exhibition of memorabilia from the war together with material from our schoolchildren as they reflect on what they have learned about the war and there will be special commemorations throughout the Benefice.

Something about autumn days, the smell of wood smoke and the leaves falling seems to encourage memories of times past for us all. There has been a great deal of change in the last hundred years and life continues to change at an ever increasing rate. But some things remain the same. Christmas is always on 25th December and is always a time of goodwill. Jesus Christ came into the world to bring peace and freedom to all humankind and we celebrate his arrival each year with gladness and hopefulness. For Peter and me, it will be our last Christmas in the Rectory and therefore I want to finish with an invitation:

on Friday 14th December from 2:00pm – 6:00pm.**

Meeting held on Monday 1st October 2018 at Reedham Village Hall

There were 7 Councillors present, the Clerk, and District Councillor Grant Nurden. 3 members of the public were in attendance. Apologies were received from Councillors Ward, Case, Holt and Grattan, and County Councillor Brian Iles. The Council meeting commenced at 7.30 pm

The meeting started with a minute silence for Mr Keith Patterson, a long time Councillor who retired from the Council in May.

Mrs Pat Bagshaw was welcomed to the Council as a new Councillor.

District Councillor Nurden reported that the new joint Broadland and South Norfolk Managing Director will be appointed this week. He is likely to be Mr Trevor Holden, currently Chief Executive of Luton Borough Council.

The Chairman of the Village Hall Committee Chris Bradbury gave the following report: the play equipment safety inspection for October was not yet complete. Quotes have been received for 2 pieces of fitness equipment and a replacement for the wooden slide in the small children's play area. The September Cash Bingo jackpot was not won, the jackpot stands at £230 in 53 numbers or less. Bonfire Night will be on the Saturday 3rd November from 6 to 8:30pm approx. The new Stage School for 6 to 16 year olds taster session went very well with 22 attending. There are now 24 children enrolled.

2 planning applications were considered: the Post Office applied for a change of use to part time post office and full time tea room; a retrospective application for change of use from incidental annexe to holiday let unit was received from Greenbanks, 2 School Hill NR13 3TJ. The Council had no objections to either of the applications.

The War Memorial is now Grade II listed.

The Council agreed to join a new Tree Warden Network after the disbandment of the one previously run by Broadland District Council.

An Allotment Association AGM is to be held on 29th October at 7:30pm in the **15.** Lounge at the Village Hall. Everyone is welcome to attend. There are currently 2 plots available at the allotments. Please contact the Clerk for further details.

Progress on reopening the Permissive Path was briefly discussed with an update being provided by Councillor Hale.

A meeting has been arranged with the grass cutting contractors in order to talk about the service received this year.

Councillor Hale has arranged to meet the landowner to discuss the ongoing problems with flooding at the 2nd Limpenhoe turning.

The possible listing of the Swing Bridge was discussed. The Council were very much in favour of retaining the structure as it is as they feel it is an iconic piece of Victorian architecture and is an important part of the village identity.
