In Holy Week, the Church concentrates on presenting the events surrounding Christ's Passion to any who would take notice. Many don't, of course; as at the time, there will be many passers by. But for those of us in the Church who follow most closely, there is little to support any misplaced sense of spiritual superiority or complacency. The main characters in the Gospel accounts – many of whom should have known better – present us with the worst of human nature. The religious leaders conspire; the Governor gives in to them and condemns an innocent man; the servants of the state (the soldiers) do their job and mock and execute. Judas hands over his friend; Peter denies him; the twelve desert him.

As he walks to the cross, Jesus knows that others after him will also suffer rejection, injustice, torture and death at the hands of their fellow human beings. Luke tells of women lamenting in his train: Jesus turns to them and tells them to weep rather for themselves and their children, because worse is to come. As we are conscious in our own time of injustice and pain; of scapegoating and political expediency, we can be strengthened by the knowledge that Jesus chose to place himself among and alongside those who suffer such things.

Yet in the Gospel accounts, there are glimpses of the better side of human nature – some of them from characters who appear out of nowhere. The women from Galilee who stick with Jesus, albeit at a safe distance; and who come to his tomb as soon as they are able, albeit on an unnecessary mission. That was to anoint his body; but that had already been done by the unnamed woman who sensed his fate and responded with an expression of love and generosity. There was also the generosity and courage of Joseph of Arimathea, in providing Jesus with a tomb and burial, when nobody else was around to do it. And Luke tells of the recognition afforded Jesus by one of the criminals hanging next to him. Such acts of human love, faithfulness and courage can give us hope when the world seems to be heading in the wrong direction.

And throughout it all is Jesus: thinking of others; praying for those who've crucified him; speaking kindly to the penitent thief. And after his resurrection, sending word through Mary Magdalene to those who'd denied and deserted him. For the good news of the divine victory of love and life over sin and death is for all.

Including those passers by. Simon of Cyrene was compelled by the soldiers to carry Jesus' cross. Commentators think that the very fact that we know his name (and that Mark gives us the names of two of his sons) means that for him this wasn't an isolated, one-off encounter with the Son of God.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 3rd March 2025 in the Village Hall

There were 9 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 5 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm.

Lynne Hardy was co-opted on to the Council and signed the Declaration of Acceptance of Office.

D. Cllr Nurden reported that as part of the devolution process the County Council is now one of those preferred for the Mayoral authority for Suffolk and Norfolk, elections to be held in May 2026.

Broadland District Council have agreed a 0% council tax increase on their share of the tax, however council tax will still increase due to charges from other bodies. Charges for brown bins will increase by £3 per year.

A grant for Reedham Church for £1500 for churchyard maintenance for the year 2025-2026 was approved by the Council.

The Council accepted a quote of £890 + VAT from The Acorn Workshop for a lectern style aluminium frame interpretation panel, to be sited near the war memorial, commemorating the 80th anniversary of the crashing of the 2 B17 bombers on the marshes on 21st February 1944.

Cllr Endall will form a working group to assist him in assembling artwork for the panel.

Cllr Hale read the informal minutes from a meeting with Justin Coote of Badger Building held to discuss the 2nd phase Barn Owl Close development. Details of the build timetable, working times and footpath closure had been discussed and also information provided on contact arrangements during the build.

To encourage greater public attendance at the Annual Parish Meeting on Monday 28th April, Cllr George and the Clerk are hoping to make this a more social occasion with an informal seating arrangement giving more opportunity for the public and councillors to mix, also with the provision of refreshments at the end of the meeting.

Speed sensor - In January the speed sensor was located in Mill Road near Church View Close facing North, collecting data from traffic entering the village. The speed limit here is 30mph.

The 85th percentile was 27.8 mph; the average speed was 22.2 mph. The average vehicles per day was 438.

Middle Hill traffic restriction - The consultation has been carried out and there were several objections to the proposals. This will now need to go through the delegated decision process with a timescale of 3–6 months.
