As I work alongside older people as a member of the clergy, I'm conscious that many have the experience of finding that they can no longer do what they used to: ageing bodies are no longer fully functional (sight, mobility, heart, ...); energy levels aren't what they were. I'm also conscious that I'm getting older and wondering when I might have to start living with some of the problems I see in others; already I'm having to wear glasses more often than not – and than I would like to! Some of these things can be overcome by treatment or assistance; and there's nothing wrong with investigating whether a cure is possible; but in many cases they are the sort of thing we have to learn to live with. Of course, chronic health problems can occur at any age; and then there are those other deficiencies in our make-up and personality which may go with us throughout our lives. Yes, a degree of change may be possible; but if we are to be whole people there will be imperfect aspects of ourselves which we somehow have to integrate: to deny them, to pretend that we are other than we are, is a deceptive, energy-sapping and ultimately fruitless endeavour, whether we are fooling ourselves, or trying to fool other people. The commandment "Love your neighbour as yourself' requires us to love ourselves, as we truly are, not as we would like ourselves to be – and that requires a degree of compassion towards ourselves - the same compassion that we would like others to display towards us and that we might hope to exercise towards them.

Integrating our imperfections is not something we can do entirely on our own: we need others to relate to us and accept us as we are, not as we would like them to see us. That's not always easy: partly because our personalities have been shaped by how we want to appear (perhaps strong, positive, capable, successful, popular, good, or distinctive) and partly because we might fear how others might react to our vulnerabilities — will they try to exploit them, or change how they view and treat us? Our culture is not always compassionate in its responses. What's true for individuals is also true for organisations. Yes, organisations need to be accountable; but if the culture is dominated by name and shame, litigation, or punishes anything less than 100%, then we shouldn't be surprised if they become over concerned with reputation, less than transparent, or content to let others take the blame for their shortcomings.

As we enter Lent, the Church walks with one who was content to be known more for his vulnerability than his ability. Jesus' active ministry teaches us a lot; but it is on the cross that he most deeply communicates who he is and how he feels about us. God is no longer characterised by omnipotence, but incorporates (embodies) human frailty. The capacity for divine compassion towards imperfect human being is revealed. Which, given that God knows us as we truly are, rather than as we would like him to see us, is a source of grace and peace.

Parish Notes

World Day of Prayer this year uses material from the women of Palestine – presumably that was lined up well before the worsening of the long-running conflict. Our two local services (open to men and women) are at the Methodist churches in Acle (2.00pm) and Freethorpe (2.30pm) on Friday Ist March.

Acle Parochial Church Council was initially perplexed by word that we were listed in an article in the EDP: "Norfolk churches received £870k in government funds in 2023". When we located it we realised this referred to the Listed Places of Worship Scheme. Initiated by Gordon Brown in 2001, this welcome Scheme refunds the VAT churches have to pay on repairs and related work: it was threatened with termination not so long ago and we lobbied for its extension. In other words, the Government is just returning to us the money we have paid them – not quite what the headline implies!

We have two offerings for **Lent**: one based in Acle (but open to the whole benefice) and one (led by Sr Heidi Marie) within our normal Lent services and on our website (go to www.abychurches.co.uk and scroll down to find Audio):-

You Can Be Serious! Meeting Jesus Afresh in John's Gospel. This York Course is written by Bishop David Wilbourne (a former chaplain to two Archbishops of York, known for his insight and sense of humour). Acle Churches Together will be following it in 5 sessions on Monday afternoons in Lent, starting on 26th February: 2.30pm at Acle Methodist Church. Read the chapter concerned before attending the session.

'My God In Whom I Trust' ... <u>- Lent Reflections by Sister Heidi Marie</u> This year I will be offering Lent reflections during the Sunday Worship. The theme this year will be exploring 'My God In Whom I Trust', which is part of Psalm 91. Using the Sunday readings, we will be looking more specifically at the nature of God in whom we trust. Reedham Remembers.....On 21st February 1944 two B17 bombers from the 385th Bomb Group Great Ashfield, collided over and crashed in Reedham Marshes; they were returning from a bombing mission over Germany and sadly all 21 crew members lost their lives.

To commemorate the 80th Anniversary, Reedham Parish Council is holding a Service of Remembrance.

The event is on **Wednesday 21st February 2024**, beginning at 11am, conducted by local clergy, with an Honor Guard from the USAF Mildenhall, Royal British Legion standard bearers from local branches, bugle/cornet player & wreath laying. Jobs in the garden in February

Cut down deciduous ornamental grasses left standing over winter, before fresh shoots appear.

Divide large clumps of Snowdrops and Winter Aconites after flowering (in the green), and replant to start new colonies.

Pot on and pinch out autumn-sown sweet peas to encourage side shoots to form.

Firm back down any plants that have been lifted by frost or loosened by windrock.

Spread a layer of well-rotted manure around roses and shrubs. Remove netting from ponds.

Chit first-early potato tubers.

Finish winter pruning fruit trees and soft fruits, including apples, autumn raspberries and blackcurrants.



A Talk & Presentation by Historian, Author & Aviation Archeologist Ian McLachlan




At Reedham Village Hall on Friday 2nd February 2024 at 19:30pm

On February 21st 1944 two B176 Flying Fortresses #42-37963 & #42-31370 from the 385th Bomb Group Great Ashfield, were part of a 900-plane bombing mission that was returning to base, and was only a few minutes from landing. In trajic circumstances they collided in the cloudy skies over the marshes near Readham...all 21 crew lost their lives.

Ian McLachlan gives a fascinating account of his research into the tragedy over Reedham when two B-17 Flying Fortress bombers collided exactly 80 years ago. Ian relates how Time Team became involved to support the establishment of a memorial honouring and remembering the young airmen who lost their lives in an incident now woven into the history of the community"
