From the Rectory

I share my surname with an island which has an unusually high profile in the news at the moment – because the Trump administration wants to make it part of the USA.

Who owns a particular piece of this planet can be an important consideration; although what really matters is how they use the power that gives them to direct what happens there. We don't know what local government will look like in this region in five years' time: while the configuration is not irrelevant, the actual decisions on local policy will affect us more than the administrative area within which they are taken. When we admire a landscape, ownership of its individual compartments is generally irrelevant, unless there are what we perceive to be scars or inappropriate developments. I have walked in places where footpaths are maintained and there are tracts of open-access land; and I have walked where barricading fences obscure the view and signs tell me my presence isn't welcomed! In each case the land is owned by somebody; but the impact is very different.

Land and its ownership is a key concept in the Hebrew Bible (the Old Testament); yet those scriptures also promote the radical idea that the land really belongs to God – a perspective also reflected in the culture of some indigenous peoples. By the time of the New Testament we find a more familiar picture, with most people living in settlements, with most of the land beyond controlled by a smaller number of landowners. Jesus adopted the role of an itinerant preacher and claimed that he had nowhere to lay his head. In the stories he told, a landowner generally represents God; we are to identify with the tenants and workers: paying our dues, investing our talents, experiencing God's generosity.

Perhaps the main affinity I have with Greenland has little to do with who owns it: it is the birds, particularly the Pink-footed Geese, which breed there (and Iceland) but come to enliven our Norfolk winters. Although they have to adapt to changes in climate and land use, they pay no respect to human administrations or borders: generation after generation, they speak of the impermanence and arbitrary nature of our claims of ownership and control.

I am also connected with people in very different parts of the world by being a Christian, through networks like the Anglican Communion (brought to me through the USPG Prayer Diary). There are particular opportunities to engage across borders in January, with the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity – which this year used material from the Armenian Orthodox Church – and in March, with the women-led World Day of Prayer, which on Friday 6th this year connects us with Nigeria. We can find we exist under very different regimes; we can learn

about their challenges, injustices and joys, so as to pray with them more **4.** meaningfully; and we can celebrate the faith we have in common, which knows no boundaries, for we are all creatures on God's earth and citizens of heaven. In the love of God,

Extraordinary Meeting held on Sunday 11th January 2026 in the Village Hall Lounge
There were 8 Councillors present, the Clerk, and 58 members of the public.

This meeting was called by the Chairman Cllr Hale to consider rescinding or amending the resolution passed on Monday 1st December relating to a private meeting with Taylor Wimpey, following the receipt of new information.

Cllr Hale explained to the public that the reason for reconsidering the decision was the receipt of information that surveyors had been seen in the field of the potential development site. He also noted that comments on social media suggested some members of the public might view the private meeting as underhand, and he wished to address those concerns openly.

The Council heard views from the public during the public participation session, where concerns and opinions were expressed regarding the previously agreed private meeting with Taylor Wimpey. Public participation indicated that the private meeting with Taylor Wimpey should proceed.

The Council considered the resolution passed on Monday 1st December taking into account the information received and the views expressed during public participation. It was decided to continue with the meeting as originally planned.
