When my father died in 1996 my mother moved to live in the Alms houses opposite the church and involved herself in village/church life. She provided coffee and a loo break for Peter, Tess Trueman, and Brenda between services some Sundays.

When we lost lovely Janet Church, I had the privilege to take over Ladies Christian Link and to become part of the team who organise the yearly service for World Day of Prayer.

I have attended many services and fundraising/social events at churches in the wider Benefice as well as serving on the Benefice Council and count many people as friends.

It is obvious that I am going to miss you all. May the love of God continue to shine on you all.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Annual Council Meeting held on Monday 11th May 2026 in the Village Hall
There were 10 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 6 members of the public.

Cllr Claire Thomas was elected Chair of Reedham Parish Council for the year 2026/27.

Cllr Lesley George was re-elected as Vice-Chair of Reedham Parish Council to serve for the year 2026/27.

The new Reedham Primary School Academy Head, Ali Hambley, introduced herself to Council members and was welcomed to the village by Cllr Thomas. The new head explained a wish to bring the school even more into the community and confirmed that anyone who wants to visit is welcome to do so.

The recently elected County Councillor for the Acle District, Justine Thomas, addressed the Council briefly, giving a short history of her time at the District Council and highlighting the importance of Parish Councils in the community. A commitment was made to help with county-level matters and to attend meetings whenever possible.

D. Cllr Nurden advised that the Broadland District Council Community at Heart awards are open and encouraged everyone to put forward any nominations.

A grant of £1,500 for Reedham Church churchyard maintenance for the year 2026-2027 was approved.

The Clerk presented 3 quotes for a replacement bench on the triangle at Witton Green. The Council approved the quote of £461 + VAT from Earth Anchors for a recycled plastic bench.

Cllr George gave a report on the Annual Parish Meeting held on 16th April: overall the meeting went well with participation from local groups and organisations. However, it was disappointing that public attendance was lower than last year despite the same level of publicity. A consideration for next year may be the inclusion of a public speaker.

Cllr Bagshaw suggested that the tennis courts may be used more if the alternative of pickleball was offered. The Village Hall Chairman commented that this was considered in 2018 and there was no interest. He advised that the tennis courts are used regularly by its members. He also noted that he had been contacted shortly before the meeting by a member of the public expressing opposition to the introduction of pickleball. It was decided not to discuss this further at this time.

Following concerns raised about speeding on Station Road and the data collected from the SAM2, Cllr Walton has arranged for a mobile speed monitoring unit to visit the village and rotate between several locations. He will report back to the Council once the visits have taken place.

In April the speed sensor was located in New Town on Freethorpe Road, facing North, collecting data from traffic coming towards the village. The speed limit here is 40mph. The 85th percentile was 42.4 mph; the average speed was 36 mph. The average vehicles per day was 908.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 1st June 2026 in the Village Hall

There were 6 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 4 members of the public.

The Clerk gave an update to the Council:

Following the removal of a tree on Riverside due to Ash Dieback, a resident reported that the remaining stump was a trip hazard. The District Council was notified and they advised that the stump is visible above the grass and is not considered hazardous. A replacement tree may be planted next year.

The Woodland Walk survey and guided walk took place on Friday 29th May with Jo Parmenter and lasted around an hour and a half. Jo has identified 82 distinct species along the route and 122 in total.

Jo also asked that everyone is notified that there are rogue traders in the village offering to cut trees and trim hedges, and highlighted the need to know whether a Tree Preservation Order (TPO) applies before any work is carried out.

She also advised that trees and hedges should not be cut during bird nesting season without checking for nesting birds. Professional tree surgeons are required to check for nests before carrying out work.

D. Cllr Nurden has been made aware of issues with waste bins being damaged through mishandling. He asked that any cases of bin damage caused by mishandling are reported to him, as he intends to raise the matter.

Cllr Nurden still has his ward member grant of £1,000 available for community groups.

Cllr Thomas emphasised her wish for the Council to be known as one that listens to residents.

The first councillor surgery was held last month, but no residents attended. Cllr Thomas highlighted that the surgeries provide an informal opportunity for residents to raise concerns and to help shape the way the Council moves forward. The next councillor surgery will take place on Saturday 27th June at 10.30am in the Village Hall Lounge and will be hosted by Cllr Lesley George. Tea and coffee will be available.

Comments were received from a member of the public regarding an overgrown hedge on Mill Road. Photos were supplied to the Council showing that the hedge is causing a pedestrian safety concern. Clarion Housing, as the landowner, has previously been contacted but no action has been taken. As the hedge is now affecting the highway, the matter is likely to fall within the responsibility of Highways.

CLERK to contact NCC Highways and copy in the County Councillor.

Cllr Walton reported that the local Beat Officer, PC Jackie Chambers, has monitored speeding in the village and that he is awaiting an update on the results.

In May the speed sensor was located on Halvergate Road near Pettitts car park collecting data from traffic entering the village. The speed limit here is 30 mph.

The 85th percentile was 32.6 mph; the average speed was 23.1 mph. The average vehicles per day was 293. This is comparable to the data collected at this location in April last year.

FINDING MILITARY VETERANS IN NORFOLK

charity: 1208763

According to Government figures there are over 40,000 veterans in Norfolk. This is the highest percentage of any County in England, with an average of 6% of the population! **Veterans Central, a charity based at West Raynham SHQ, NR21 7PL near Fakenham**, currently engages with around 900 veterans and a spokesperson said: “with those numbers in mind we are clearly still ‘missing a few.’

We need YOUR help in finding veterans across Norfolk so we can reach out to them. YOU may be a veteran, have veterans in your extended family or friends, or have a veteran in your neighbourhood. In many cases this will involve people that we are currently not reaching and are unaware of the support that is available – from direct help with specific issues to the more broad ‘somewhere to go and something to do’.

Veterans Central was launched in 2023 with the dual aims of providing veterans with a sense of purpose, a reason to get up that day and go and achieve something, or somewhere to go for socialisation, what we refer to as the 4Cs (Coffee-Cake-Conversation-Company). **Veterans Central is open 3 days a week, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday from 10 to 3.** As part of the ‘finding more veterans’ under the Veterans Voice project, that also run monthly drop-ins (coffee, cake and conversation) in Swaffham (in the Assembly Rooms on the last Tuesday each month). There are also several Armed Forces Breakfast Clubs across Norfolk.

WHAT IS A VETERAN?

Since the project started in 2023, the volunteers have completed over 40,000 hours of work at West Raynham on the SHQ
