From the Rectory

I was struck by some words of Archbishop Desmond Tutu quoted in *Acle Churches Together* Lent course: *I am not an optimist: I am a prisoner of hope.*

Wherever we look, there seems to be little ground for optimism at the moment: the climate and biodiversity crises (the subject of our course); enduring conflicts; global economic instability; unpalatable consequences of the financial pressures on government, councils, schools, businesses and households. But the more pessimistic we are about our ability to overcome these problems, either in the short term (conflict and economics) or even ultimately (climate and biodiversity) the more we need hope: just to enable us to keep going; to keep trying to turn the tide and head in a positive direction.

As the Archbishop's words imply, Christians don't really have the option of giving up or giving in, however tempting that may be. We believe in the loving purposes of God; in the resurrection of Jesus Christ; in the empowerment the Holy Spirit gives us to face the challenges that life, and forces opposed to God's ways, confront us with. Hope, St. Paul says, is one of the three things which last for ever. That doesn't mean that everything is going to turn out well for us, or we can just leave it all to God to sort out all the world's problems. There were those in Judah, egged on by the false prophets, who believed that the Lord would never allow their nation, monarchy and temple to be overrun: the word of the Lord through Jeremiah and other prophets was that, if they didn't do anything about it, he would; and he did. Just as *God did not spare his own Son ...* Another quotation from the course: *Without God we cannot; without us he will not.*

But God didn't leave his people there. Even among the words of these same prophets we find prophecies of restoration, albeit on the other side of disaster. They, like the late Archbishop, were *prisoners of hope*.

It's for us to latch on to, even originate hope. If we look, we will find options: actions we can take, attitudes we can adopt. Even if the odds appear to be against us; or if nobody else seems to be taking any notice: perhaps they are waiting for people like us to take the first step.

Christian Aid Week (11th - 17th May) is an annual expression, not only of compassion for those who suffer, but of hope: seeking to rebuild and restore after conflict; to build resilience in the face of catastrophic climate change; to empower people to be able to reap a reward from their labours, feed their families and resist injustice and oppression. Our hope for them strengthening their hopes for themselves. Envelopes will be distributed around Acle to as many houses as we can (can you help?): they can be dropped off at key locations in the village (including the Rectory and Carter's Butchers). Or, if you prefer, or don't live in Acle, donate via www.christianaid.org.uk – thank you.

Meeting held on Monday 7th April 2025 in the Village Hall

There were 10 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 9 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.30pm.

D. Cllr Nurden reported that the consultation for the devolution process ends on 19th April and he encouraged everyone who wants to have their say to respond with their comments before that date.

A member of the public reported that Badger Building are not complying with the conditions of the build for Phase 2 of the Barn Owl Close development, including turning in the current Barn Owl Close. Cllr Hale requested that these problems are reported to the Council so that Badger Building can be notified.

Cllr Hale thanked everyone who participated in the litter pick on the 29th March. 20 volunteers took part, and 18 bags of litter were collected. It is hoped that this can continue on an informal basis and that a grant can be obtained to buy litter picking sticks for use in the village.

A new village sign has been made to be situated along Riverside. After discussion the suggested location for this is on the small grass area near the slipway.

The Clerk to contact Broadland District Council to confirm suitability of location.

Options for publicising the Annual Parish Meeting were discussed. It will be advertised on the website, Facebook page and notice boards. The Council also decided to organise a leaflet drop in the village.

Speed sensor – In March the speed sensor was located on Freethorpe Road near Station Drive collecting data from traffic entering the village. The speed limit here is 30mph.

The 85th percentile was 32.8 mph; the average speed was 27.1 mph. The average vehicles per day was 529. Compared to the last time the speed sensor was at this location in September 2023 with an average of 369 vehicles per day, this shows quite a large increase in traffic.

The defibrillator located at the Humpty Dumpty brewery is now available for use and registered on the Circuit.

The Council discussed the possibility of installing bleed kits in the defibrillator cabinets at a cost of approximately £90 each. A member of the public, who acts as a first responder, pointed out that a bleed kit in a locked cabinet could not necessarily be accessed in time. A decision on bleed kits was deferred until the Clerk can provide the Council with more information.

The Clerk received an email regarding dangerous parking at the school. This has been referred to the headmistress, Beth Spaul, who will be reminding parents again about considerate and safe parking.

Time and Date of Next Meeting

The next scheduled meeting of the Parish Council is Monday 12th April 2025 at 7.30pm, in the Village Hall lounge. Further details will be published on the website, Facebook page and notice board by the Clerks nearer the time. All parishioners are welcome to attend.

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in Reedham Village 13. Hall at 7.30pm on Monday 28th April. Complimentary refreshments will be served at the end of the meeting.
