I remember once writing, Everybody should be a bit potty about something. Apart from my current interest in flies(!) I have a longer-standing specialism in one particular butterfly which lives in elm trees (there's a small colony near the Pawseys). In the world of wildlife I can think of people fascinated by fungus gnats, plant galls, earthworms, and frogs and toads (welcome back, Garth). Thinking back over the year I've rubbed shoulders with people passionate about WWII aircraft and their crews; village signs; medieval culture; the railways; and cycling (on the road most Sundays!). Enthusiasm is widespread. And while most of us would at some moment like to convert the world to our particular interest, we know that isn't going to happen. Indeed, it wouldn't really be desirable – earthworms need somebody to speak up for them! The range of people's interests speaks of the diversity and richness of life – and of the diversity and richness of people.

Whether natural or human, all this speaks to me of the abundance of God's creation – in depth as well as breadth. There's a whole universe to discover in plant galls or motorcycles or the art of baking cakes.

So is God potty about anything? I suppose one could argue he must also be keen on slugs, else why ever create them? A poem I heard penned in reply to that sentiment saw things from the slugs' point of view: why ever create such destructive things as people? Certainly God does seem irresponsibly devoted to human beings. The Old Testament tells that God was particularly attached to the people of Israel, whether or not they deserved it. He seems to have had a particular affection for David, although at times that seems misplaced. He is said to have favoured the city of Jerusalem, though that was a problem for those living some distance away.

One of the insights of St. Paul was that, in Christ, God had extended his special favour even to the Gentiles – people who previously hadn't known him. And Jesus himself had highlighted the extent to which God is prepared to go to seek out and save the lost – and what rejoicing there is in heaven when he succeeds.

I think we must conclude that God is actually a bit potty about all of his creation; and not least about each one of us – with a special concern for the poor and misguided. And he wants us to share something of that enthusiasm.

Parish Notes

Harvest Thanksgiving will be celebrated on Sunday 6th at Acle, Freethorpe, Limpenhoe and Wickhampton. St. Edmund's Church, Acle has been told that its wheelchair ramp is too steep and should be removed from use. Very regrettably this means that the church is **not** accessible to wheelchair users for the immediate future. It's not an easy problem to solve temporarily or permanently: to comply, a ramp would need to be longer than the available distance from the door to the font. Thankfully Access 4 Acle fundraising enabled the Church Council to commission investigation of a solution several weeks ago: that architect's feasibility study should be with us soon.

Interestingly, the fact that all the medieval west end door thresholds are well above the level of the floor leads our architect to conclude that the floor of the church previously sloped and was subsequently excavated and levelled, possibly in the 17th century (leaving the font high, if not dry). This shouldn't be confused with the further lowering (by just a few inches) when the current floor was laid in 1912.

REEDHAM PARISH COUNCIL

Meeting held on Monday 2^{nd} September 2024 in the Village Hall There were 8 Councillors present, the Clerk, District Councillor Nurden and 4 members of the public. The meeting commenced at 7.32pm.

D. Cllr Nurden reported that a full Council meeting was held at the end of July, these are streamed live and available to watch online to subscribers of the YouTube channel.

Chairman of the Village Hall Chris Bradbury gave the following report:

There were no issues with the play equipment safety inspection for August.

The August Cash Bingo jackpot wasn't won, the jackpot stands for September at £230 in 57 numbers or less.

There are no film showings on the big screen until October or November.

Another successful jumble sale was held in August, thanks to everyone who helped.

RCA Stage school performed their summer production of "The Wizard of Oz" in July. It was well attended and received great feedback.

The adult drama group will perform "A Bunch of Amateurs" a comedy by Ian Hislop and Nick Newman on 27th and 28th September at 7.30pm, tickets on sale now.

The following planning applications were ratified by the Parish Council:

- i) 20220887 Construction of 27 dwellings, extension of Barn Owl Close including revision to line of footpath | Land at Barn Owl Close Reedham NR13 3TA –Amendment for footway improvements and 20mph zone. - No objection
- ii) 20211314 Construction of First Floor Side Extension, 33 Station Road Reedham Norfolk NR13 3TB Variation of condition 2 of permission amended balcony design **No objection**
- iii) BA/2024/0249/FUL Installation of 3 no. cycle charging boxes, Car Park at Ferry Inn, Ferry Road, Reedham **No objection**

No further planning applications were received for consideration.

Cllr Hale reported that he will be meeting with Jo Parmenter and representatives from the Church to discuss churchyard maintenance. The Community Payback Scheme will undertake some maintenance free of charge, the remainder to be agreed with the Parish Council.

The handrail for the Woodland Walk steps has now been repaired by the Parish Council.

The bench at the Low Common end of the Woodland Walk is broken beyond repair. Parish Clerk to look at costs for a new bench.

Witton Green drainage issues – Works to address this are going ahead week commencing 23rd September, road closures are planned as necessary for that week.

Cllr Bagshaw reported that the footpath sign at the Witton Green entrance to the Searchlight field has been vandalised and cannot be repaired. A replacement for this is being sourced.

Speed sensor - in July the sensor was located on Riverside near the green by the telephone box. The 85th percentile was 18.8mph, the average speed was 12.9mph. The average vehicles per day was 326.

In August the sensor was located in Halvergate Road near Pettitts Animal Park. The 85th percentile was 31mph, the average speed was 22.5mph. The average vehicles per day was 386, compared to 298 in April.


